READING TASK

During the summer holidays we hope you will enjoy reading lots of books.



My Reading Log

- Choose one of the books you have most enjoyed reading and complete the reading log in your pack.
- What can I write in my reading log? Here are some ideas:
 - Write a description of the main character - their looks, the way they dress, the way they talk and their personality.
 - Write about your favourite part of the book and why you liked it.
 - Write down three facts you have learned from a non-fiction book.
 - Pick out a descriptive word from the text, write it down and, using a thesaurus, write down five synonyms and antonyms for that word
 - Challenge yourself! Write a 50-word summary of the plot.

Remember to decorate your log - work will go on display in school and there will be prizes for the best!

WRITING TASK

For your writing task you need to complete **one** from the following.

'My Life'

A piece of writing that explains who you are. Try and include information about your family e.g. how many people there are in your family, where you live now, where you used to live, where you were born, which schools you have been to and which were your favourite teachers and topics and subjects, what pets you have had, where you have been on holiday, what your hobbies and interests are and who your friends are. You might want to write each section about yourself using a different paragraph. Try to include any details that might make your work more personal and interesting to read.

'My hobby'

A piece of writing that describes a favourite hobby. If you have more than one interest then include them all in this piece of writing. Try to explain your hobby - what it is, when you got interested in it, what equipment you need (if you need any!), how much time it takes up, are there any rules that you need to know, how often you take part. Imagine that the person reading your work knows absolutely nothing about your hobby. By the end of the piece of writing your teacher should know everything that there is to know about the subject!

Scan or photocopy photos if you can and then stick them in with your writing as illustrations. They will really make your work interesting to read.
